Registration

Step 1: Register at Your Department

To enroll at the **Secretariat of your Host Department**, please submit the following documents:

- One passport-size photograph
- A copy of your passport or national ID card
- Your Letter of Acceptance

Secretariat Opening Hours

The Secretariats of Faculties are open to students during the following days and times:

- Monday, Wednesday & Friday
- 11:00 a.m. 1:00 p.m.

Before going to the Secretariat to complete your registration, we recommend contacting them in advance to confirm availability on your preferred day or to schedule an appointment.

Step 2: Create Your Student Account

Once your registration is complete, the Secretariat will email you a 13-digit personal registration number.

With this number:

- 1. Go to the Webadm platform
- 2. Create your personal student account
- 3. Receive your Username
- 4. Set your Password

You'll need these credentials to access various university services, including your Academic ID Card.

Academic ID Card (Student Pass)

Your Academic Identification Card officially recognizes you as an NKUA student and grants access to:

- University libraries
- Sports facilities
- Museums
- Half-price tickets for all public transport in Greece

How to Apply for Your Academic ID

The application is completed online via the <u>Academic ID platform</u> (Ministry of Education & Religious Affairs) – Click for <u>Instructions</u>

Before starting your application, make sure you have:

- A digital photo in .jpg or .png format
- A Greek mobile phone number

Please note: The card may take up to 2 weeks to be issued.

Always carry your Academic ID when using public transportation, as must be shown during ticket inspections.



While You Wait...

Until your Academic ID is ready, you can use your **Student ID from your Home University** for reduced transportation fares — valid for students **up to 25 years old**.

Students from Non-EU (Third) Countries

Do You Need a Visa?

Depending on your citizenship and the duration of your Erasmus+ studies, **you may be required to obtain a visa before arriving in Greece**.

To find out if you need a visa, please consult the official website of the Greek Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

Contact Your Local Embassy

You are strongly advised to contact the nearest Greek Embassy or Consulate in your country for accurate and updated information regarding:

- Required documents
- Application forms
- Appointment scheduling
- Estimated processing times

Visa procedures can take time, so we strongly recommend that you start the process as early as possible to avoid delays.

Residence Permit

If you're staying in Greece for more than 90 days, you will typically need to **apply for a student residence permit after your arrival**, following entry with your visa; this permit is issued by the Greek immigration authorities (Ministry of Migration and Asylum).



If you are a student from a **non-EU country**, please ensure that you **take care of any necessary extensions to your visa or residence permit** in a timely manner. This is your personal responsibility and is essential for your legal stay in Greece throughout your studies.

Application Requirement:

To complete the online application form, you must have already received your **Acceptance Letter** from European and International Relations Department.

Finding Accommodation

Rooms at the Student Residences are not available. Therefore, students are required to arrange their own accommodation in private apartments or rooms.

It is strongly recommended that students begin their search as early as possible and consult our website for updated information.

The **Department of European and International Relations** collaborates with the **Erasmus Student Network (ESN) Kapa Athens** to help incoming international students find suitable private housing.

Rent & Deposit

- The average monthly rent for private accommodation in Athens ranges from €450–€500.
- Most landlords will ask for a **security deposit**, usually equal to **two months' rent**, paid in advance.
- This deposit is typically refunded at the end of your stay, provided:
 - No damage has been caused to the property

Healthcare

Health Coverage at NKUA

On-Campus Health Services

All registered NKUA students—including Erasmus and non-EU students—can access free medical and dental care at on-campus facilities. These include:

- General Practitioner, Dentist, Ophthalmologist, Psychiatrist & Psychologist etc.
- Nursing services and referrals for dermatological examinations
- Services available at:
 - University Club (15 Ippokratous St., Athens)
 - 1st Residence Hall Clinic (Campus, Ilisia)

Public Healthcare Access

Students without private insurance are entitled to free emergency and hospital treatment under Greece's National Health System (EOPYY). This is available through public or university hospitals, provided you present your Academic ID

Required Insurance

As a non-EU student participating in a traineeship at the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens (NKUA), you are required to have valid insurance coverage for the entire duration of your stay in Greece.

If you're a non-EU student, you must hold private insurance covering:

- 1. Accident-related permanent disability (≥€15,000/year)
- 2. Medical expenses from illness or accident (≥€1,500/year)
- 3. Comprehensive hospital care (≥€10,000/year)

Your policy must clearly mention coverage within Greece or the entire EU.

Student Restaurants

- The University offers two free meals daily from September 1 to June 30 (excluding Christmas and Easter holidays).
- Upon your arrival in Athens, you will receive instructions from your Department about the online application to access the student restaurants.

Transportation in Athens

Getting around Athens is easy and affordable, especially for students!

Public Transport

Athens has an extensive public transport network including:

- Metro (3 lines)
- Buses & Trolleys
- Tram
- Suburban Railway (Proastiakos)

Services usually operate from **05:00 to midnight**, with **metro Lines 2 & 3** running until 2:00 AM on Fridays and Saturdays.

Tickets & Student Discounts

- Standard ticket: €1.20 (valid for 90 minutes on all means of transport)
- As an Erasmus student, you are eligible for 50% discount with your Academic ID (passo).
- Until you receive your Academic ID, you can use your student card from your home university (valid only if you are under 25 years old).

The ATH.ENA Card

To access the discounted fares, you will need to issue a **Personalized ATH.ENA Card**, which is a smart travel card used on all means of public transport in Athens.

To get your card, you will need:

- Your passport or ID
- A digital photo (passport-style)
- Your Greek mobile number
- Your Academic ID (or proof of student status if not yet issued)

You can apply:

- Online at www.athenacard.gr (site in Greek ask for help if needed), or
- In person at major metro stations (e.g., Syntagma, Panepistimio, Monastiraki)

Once activated, you can top up the card with discounted monthly passes

Getting To & From Athens Airport (AIA - Eleftherios Venizelos)

Athens International Airport is well connected to the city by public and private transport. Here are your main options:

By Metro (Line 3 - Blue Line)

- Route: Airport ↔ Dimotiko Theatro
- Duration: ~40 minutes
- **Cost:** €9 (standard), €4.50 for students (with valid Academic ID)
- Frequency: Every 30 minutes
- Operating hours: ~6:30 AM 11:30 PM

Tip: Line 3 also connects with **Doukissis Plakentias**, where you can switch to the Suburban Railway.

By Express Bus

- 24/7 Service Runs day and night!
- Flat fare: €5.50 (no student discount available)
- Tickets bought from kiosks at the airport or bus terminals

Most popular routes:

- X95: Airport ↔ Syntagma (City Center)
- X96: Airport ↔ Piraeus (Port)
- X93: Airport ↔ Kifisos Intercity Bus Station
- X97: Airport ↔ Elliniko Metro Station

By Taxi / Ride Apps

- **Taxi fare:** ~€40–45 (day), ~€55 (night, 00:00–05:00)
- Flat airport-city center rate includes tolls and luggage
